

SMOKY HILL METROPOLITAN DISTRICT AWARDED COUNTY GRANT FOR NEW REFLECTION GARDEN AT CRESTLINE PARK

The Smoky Hill Metropolitan District is proud to announce that it has been awarded a grant from Arapahoe County Open Spaces to create a beautiful new Reflection Garden in Crestline Park, located just north of E. Crestline Avenue and Pitkin Street.

This exciting enhancement will transform an existing area of the park into a peaceful retreat where visitors can pause, reflect, reconnect with nature, or simply enjoy a quiet moment surrounded by beautiful landscaping. Thoughtfully designed among the park's current trees, the Reflection Garden will provide a welcoming destination for residents of all ages.

The garden will feature approximately **500 drought-tolerant plants**, including flowering perennials, ornamental grasses, shrubs, groundcover, and other water-wise landscaping selected for their seasonal color and long-term sustainability. A gently winding walking path will guide visitors through the garden to natural stone benches and seating walls, creating inviting spaces to rest and enjoy the tranquil surroundings. All stone elements—including the benches, seating walls, and signage—will be crafted from natural stone, complementing the beauty of the landscape.

As part of the project, a new Bur Oak tree will be planted to provide shade and beauty for generations to come. The memorial plaque honoring Brett Bostic, a former middle school student and neighborhood resident who passed away in 1996, will be thoughtfully relocated from the park's west entrance to a place of honor near the new tree.

The Reflection Garden will be located in the east part of Crestline Park, near the covered shelter and bench. It will be accessible from both park entrances, with the east entrance providing the most direct access.

Construction is expected to begin in August, with completion anticipated by the end of 2026. As the project progresses, we will share updates on the Reflection Garden's development and invite the community to a grand opening celebration to commemorate the completion of this exciting new addition to Crestline Park.
